#### **Disaster Relief Fund**

Altrusa International Foundation is ready to support our communities during the post-pandemic days ahead. Grants are available to help clubs support those in their communities that have been impacted by COVID-19. Applications for these grants can be initiated by an Altrusa Club President, submitted to the District Governor for approval, who will forward it to the International Foundation office for review by the Board of Trustees. There is no maximum to the amount you can request. There is one tier of the Disaster Relief Fund that allows the Foundation Chair to immediately disburse up to \$1,000 without the board's approval.
