### **Altrusa Club Disaster Recovery Service Grant**

The International Foundation provides opportunities for Altrusa Clubs worldwide to address the unmet and otherwise unfunded needs of a community or area following a disaster. Applications for these grants shall **be initiated by an Altrusa Club President submitted to the District Governor for approval, then forwarded to the International Foundation office for review by the Board of Trustees.** Disasters funded with these grants should serve an area affecting at least 100 individuals.

The following information is required in a written document:

- Altrusa club name, proposal name, date of disaster occurrence, address and contact information.
- Name/signature of person submitting proposal and name/signature of District Governor

***Note: Leslie Johnson has provided each of the club presidents with a form that should be used to provide the first two bullets of information.***

- A narrative, that describes the need and project in 500 words or less; include estimated number of recipients to be affected.
- If this is a duplicated project by another community group, describe why additional funding is needed.
- If this a collaborative effort with other community groups, list the groups and their involvement in the project. Please include details on a reputable local relief organization (with 14% or less in overhead expenses) where disaster funds may be distributed.
- Attach a document verifying the disaster - for example, a letter from a local official, statement from a first responder agency and/or media article.

### **End-of-Year Audit**

Three ways to conduct an end-of-year audit/peer review:

1. If possible, have a CPA review your financial records for free.
2. Swap financial records with a nearby club in our District and have the club/foundation treasurers perform a “peer review” of each other’s records.
3. Ask our District Treasurer to “peer review” the financial records.
