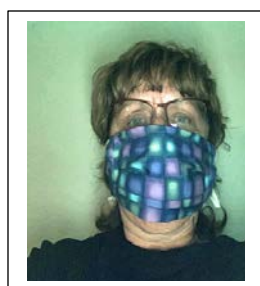

## **Pathways of Hope Awarded Disaster Relief Grant for Altrusa International Foundation**

Altrusa International Foundation provides Disaster Relief Grants to local communities in time of need. Pathways of Hope provides meals and food through the HUB of Hope food distribution and resource center in North Orange county, CA. Our club recognized the community need and nominated Pathways of Hope for a disaster relief grant. Altrusa International Foundation presented our club a \$1000 disaster relief fund check for Pathways of Hope.

Anaheim, the largest city in North Orange County, CA has tripled its homeless population in the last few years. An intensive census of homeless people in 13 cities was carried out with public funds by local law enforcement officers, homeless outreach workers and volunteers (including Altrusans) over a three week period in March and April in 2019. The tally of Anaheim, Brea, Buena Park,

Cypress, Fullerton, La Habra, La Palma, Los Alamitos, Orange, Placentia, Stanton, Villa Par and Yorba Linda found 2107 people experiencing homelessness. The population of Orange County is 3.5 million. It is the third largest county in California and the fifth largest county in the nation. It serves 100 struggling households each day with emergency food and supplies to keep them safe.

The impact of the COVID-19 has caused the need to grow substantially with parents being told to stay home from work and children home from school and school nutritional programs unavailable because of the spreading of the disease. The POH staff and volunteers are pre-packaging food bags daily which are distributed to neighbors. They are currently serving over 100 struggling households each day with this emergency food and supplies. The HUB relies on food and supply donations from churches, local businesses, grocery stores, bakeries and restaurants. These donations have dried up with the closing for churches and businesses and the panic draining of the local grocery stores. Monetary donations have also dried up due to concern over longevity of jobs and fear of running out of money as the epidemic continues. \$1000 grant from the disaster relief fund will help us cover over 200 people with food and supply relief.

Another great risk from the COVID-19 virus is the unprecedented number of people who are at risk of becoming homeless due to loss

of jobs. Pathways runs an emergency Homeless Prevention Program that offers services like emergency rental assistance to households at risk to becoming homeless.
